Lent Suggestions

1. Silence very day—5-10 minutes to be fully present with our Lord. Slow down to let God talk to us.
2. Pray at scheduled times of the day, every day.
3. Spend time in God's word at least 30 minutes.
4. Go to Confession. At least once but really twice. Carefully examine your conscience every day.
5. Daily Mass. Fit this in your schedule. Take time to receive God's extra grace.
6. Spiritual reading every day. Pick a book.
7. Fast. Just something you might be a little too attached to. Food, social media, gossip.
8. Almsgiving. Practice serving the poor, clean out closets, etc.. Detach from worldly things.
9. Invite someone to Mass. Give them an opportunity to participate with you.
10. Go home and love your family. St. Theresa of Calcutta reminds us that we can change the world by first loving our families.
